Classifying imperial Russianness: race and hybridity in 19th and early 20th century Russian imperial anthropology

The talk will give an insight on scientific strategies to categorize race within the frame of the Russian Empire as a multi-ethnic state. Thus, the talk is a contribution on the emergence of anthropology as a state science and the interaction of state and elites in dealing with imperial subjects.

Professor Dr. Marina Mogilner holds the Edward and Marianna Thaden Chair in Russian and East European Intellectual History at the University of Illinois at Chicago. Since 1999 she has been Editor (Russia and NIS) of the International Quarterly *Ab Imperio*. Between 2008 and 2013 she was Academic Director of the Center for Jewish History and Culture at Kazan Federal University (Kazan, Russian Federation) and between 2003 and 2013 Academic Director of the Center for the Study of Nationalism and Empire (Kazan, Russian Federation). Between 2000 and 2003 she was CEP/Bosch Lecturer at Kazan State University, Department of History.
